International invited competetion about one of the five "villes nouvelles" of Paris.

ARKEN's idea was a linear urban corridor along a tram line connecting two important south-going trunk rail lines towards the south of France and the then newly introduced TGV line. The urban corridor connects five original communities into one structure, a bend helps create a central lake and park area.

The concept emphasizes the valuable legacy of traditional grid structures.

The landscape of groves and tree rows was enhanced as a pre-cultivated pattern to support the growing linear structure.

Tram stops give a sequence of squares along the central core of the urban corridor.

Landscape features of hills and hahas were used to mitigate the effect of the major circular highway around Paris adjacent to the site.
